Honorees

Ken Dryden, OC, BA, MLL

Honorary Doctor of Letters

Ken Dryden is a celebrated and legendary athlete who maintains a strong team spirit in his post-hockey career and continues to be an inspiring leader committed to improving community.

Dryden successfully combined his advanced amateur athletics with high-level academic achievement. Originally selected in the NHL Amateur Draft in 1964, he declined and chose to pursue a Bachelor of Arts degree at Cornell University — an uncommon choice for a young athlete.

After completing his degree, Dryden made his NHL debut with the Montreal Canadiens in 1971 and soon made his mark on the game. Dryden's success as a goaltender helped the Montreal Canadiens win six Stanley Cup titles. That success, along with his All-Star (and 1972 Summit Series) appearances, helped secure his place in the Hockey Hall of Fame.

Following his retirement from the sport, Dryden pursued a law degree at McGill. Today, his illustrious hockey career is complemented by his renown as a successful politician, author, sports broadcaster and philanthropist.

Dryden was a Member of Parliament from 2004 to 2011 and served as the former Minister of Social Development. He has

authored several books, on topics ranging from the game of hockey to educational system reform and the political future of Canada. "The Game" was nominated for a Governor General's Award.

Dryden is an ardent advocate for concussion education and continues to shine the spotlight on prevention and treatment. He also is committed to educational access for youth in care — exemplified by the Ken Dryden Scholarships.

He has earned several awards and honours, and was recently appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada, an honour of highest standing conferred to those serving Canada and humanity at large.

Richard Frost, BA (Hons), MA, MPA

Honorary Doctorate of Laws

Throughout his career and particularly in his role as Chief Executive Officer of the Winnipeg Foundation, Rick Frost has demonstrated extraordinary skill in cultivating partnerships that connect donors with opportunities to meet the needs of our community. He works tirelessly to support programs and people who strengthen Winnipeg; his deep care and commitment to adding community capacity at the grassroots level is evident to all who know him.

Frost was an early supporter of and advocate for two important initiatives at The University of Winnipeg aimed at breaking down barriers to post-secondary education and closing the graduation gap for inner city, Indigenous, and new immigrant children and youth. First, he helped launch the Innovative Learning Centre in 2006 which has resulted in thousands of inner city children attending UWinnipeg's popular Eco-U Summer Camp and the Eco-Kids on Campus program. Both of these initiatives nurture in youth the joy of learning and exploring the natural world and are offered free of charge to participants thanks to the support of Frost and the Winnipeg Foundation. He also created the Winnipeg Foundation's Nourishing Potential Endowment Fund.

This critically important program ensures nutritious meals are available daily to help children reach their full potential. UWinnipeg's WiiChiiwaakanak Learning Centre is able to provide hundreds of wholesome snacks to inner city children and youth who attend the after-school Let's Talk Science club and Powwow club because of this program.

Frost has earned a reputation for building relationships based on trust, respect and mutual understanding. He has offered his expertise and insights on numerous local, national and international boards, including the CancerCare Manitoba Foundation, Community Foundations of Canada and the Premier's Economic Advisory Council.

Through his unwavering integrity and generosity of spirit, Frost is the personification of community leadership.





Ajit Kaur Deol, OM, BA, MA, BEd, BPE

Honorary Doctor of Laws

Ajit Kaur Deol, a retired teacher and principal who came to Canada from India in 1967, has committed herself to issues in education, social services and multiculturalism throughout her career. Leading by example, Deol believes that every individual has the responsibility to contribute and become a catalyst for positive change in society.

She is also a strong advocate for education and has worked tirelessly to improve the lives of her students — especially the marginalized and disenfranchised — through better policies and governance.

In the early 1970s Deol was principal of Carline McMorland School for the Mentally Challenged in Marathon, ON. She developed the school, which was initially located in a church basement, from five students to 24 over a span of six years, eventually integrating her pupils into regular classes at Marathon High School from the basement. This integration allowed her students to take part in all elements of everyday life, thereby improving the quality of their educational experience. Her Marathon High School integration program became a template for other Ontario schools.

Deol is a model Canadian citizen and a pillar of support for her Indo-Canadian community who has facilitated

intercultural understanding from the local to provincial levels. She has served on the Boards of numerous organizations, including the Manitoba Human Rights Commission, the Canadian Multiculturalism Council, Winnipeg Boys and Girls Clubs (Winnipeg) and the East Indian Support and Advocacy Group, promoting intercultural tolerance and understanding.

Deol has earned several awards and distinctions, including the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Pin, Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal, the Distinguished Community Service Award (National Indo-Canadian Council, Manitoba Chapter) and is an Officer of the Order of Manitoba.

George Heshka, BEd

Honorary Doctor of Letters

Since 1980, George Heshka has been the principal of Sisler High School, Manitoba's largest school. Sisler is known as "a mini United Nations" and cited as one of Canada's most multicultural schools. Heshka's work and commitment has spanned over three decades and has greatly contributed to the pride and legacy of Sisler High School, which is renowned for providing quality education to generations of leaders.

Heshka is known as a visionary leader in the heart of Winnipeg's north end. His progressive ideas have transformed Sisler into an innovative institute with award-winning programs in career exploration, youth entrepreneurship, women in trades, robotics, and self directed learning. He also forged a partnership between UWinnipeg and Sisler that allows Sisler students to receive university credits while in high school — enabling a head start on post-secondary education and making it more accessible.

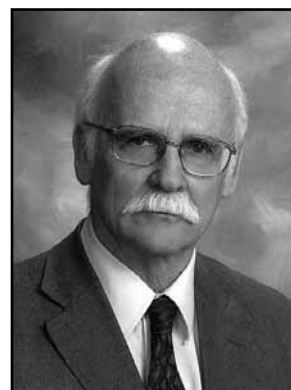
In 2011, Sisler became one of 63 schools recognized by Microsoft as a Pathfinder School. The Innovative Schools program helps school leaders embrace innovation and implement technology effectively to support teaching and learning. This accomplishment allowed Sisler to send

a group of students to Washington, DC to showcase Sisler's innovative teaching practices around the world. Heshka's efforts have solidified Sisler's academic foundation such that Sisler is ranked one of Canada's ten best schools and the best all-around high school, by Maclean's Magazine.

Heshka's students describe him as "an awesome principal, who is caring and helpful". He is highly respected by his peers and was nominated as "the greatest Manitoban" in a campaign led by the Winnipeg Free Press, for his brilliance, passion for excellence, and a love and respect for his students that has transcended generations.

David Cheal, BSocSc, PhD

Professor Emeritus

David Cheal's career spans 41 years at The University of Winnipeg, representing the best in academia: outstanding scholarship, an effective and challenging teaching style much appreciated by several generations of students, exemplary research which attracted significant grants including from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, and unrivaled service to the University community.

Dr. Cheal is a leading scholar with a national and international reputation in the areas of family, aging and demography which helped put UWinnipeg's Department of Sociology on the map. When he retired in 2010, he had authored 11 books, several of which are classics and bestsellers in the field, and will soon publish the third edition with Oxford University Press of *Canadian Families Today*, co-edited with Patrizia Albanese. He has contributed chapters to 30 books, published over 20 peer-reviewed articles, and is in much demand as an editor. For many years he was Associate Editor of the prestigious Canadian Journal of Sociology. He has delivered numerous conference presentations and guest lectures and has been a sought after participant in panels, workshops and seminars.

His students relished his classes, which he conducted more as a series of questions that students need to consider, rather than as a series of statements to memorize. In 1995, he served as the Canadian Policy Research Network Research Fellow.



Dr. Cheal has been an active participant in University life, offering his service to a myriad of activities including the University of Winnipeg Senate and numerous Senate committees, the Library Board, the Academic Planning Committee, and the Faculty Nominating Committee, among many others.

For his highly productive and distinguished record of scholarship, his unflagging dedication to UWinnipeg, and his inspiration to students and professors alike, The University of Winnipeg welcomes Dr. David Cheal as Professor Emeritus.

Joel Novek, BA (Hons), MA, PhD

Professor Emeritus

Throughout his 36-year career in the Department of Sociology at The University of Winnipeg, Novek distinguished himself for his breadth of scholarship and research in emerging fields including hog farming in Western Canada, technology and the workplace, the grain trade in the information age, and sociology of the environment.

Novek has published two books and nearly 50 articles, has presented close to 30 conference papers and is responsible for five major reports. Among his many accomplishments, he was the Visiting Research Associate for the Centre of Policy Alternatives, Massachusetts Institute of Technology; a Visiting Research Associate at the University of Paris Sorbonne; and was awarded the Diana Forsythe Award from the American Medical Informatics Association for research at the crossroads between social science and medical informatics.

While Novek's books, articles and conference papers represent a significant and original contribution to Canadian sociology, his leadership is not limited to scholarly endeavors. He has contributed in essential ways to the growth and strength of UWinnipeg, serving as Chair of the Sociology Department for nearly a decade, creating new courses dealing with the environment and technology, and offering important curriculum revisions and development.

Beyond the University, he has shared his expertise on environmental and food security issues as a member of the Manitoba Food Charter and with Hogwatch Manitoba, and has been active in the Winnipeg Jewish community dealing with the Middle East conflict and peace.

Enid Brown, BA, MSc

Instructor Emeritus

Enid Brown worked at The University of Winnipeg for close to three decades, as an Instructor, Coordinator, and Chair, leaving a legacy of significant contributions before her retirement in 2011. She has been an integral force in the development, growth, and creation of the Faculty of Kinesiology, which was approved by Senate and officially came into being on July 1, 2012.

Brown has been a consummate teacher who garnered the respect of her students, colleagues, and peers. She constantly updated her course materials, making them relevant and sought after by students. She was consistently a favoured instructor and nominated often for the Robson Teaching Award — the highest honour students can give their teacher.

Active in research, and in presenting at conferences, Brown has been published in peer-reviewed journals, and was a contributing author to a popular Kinesiology textbook.

Brown was responsible for creating a work environment that contributed substantially to the growth and evolution of Kinesiology at The University of Winnipeg. She is a strong advocate for health and fitness within the University, and became one of the leading advocates in the province.

Brown's devotion to her field went beyond the classroom and research. She worked actively in the external

community, establishing and maintaining contacts with local, provincial and national exercise and sport science associations. She was a leader among the certified Exercise Physiologists in Manitoba and in promoting the regulation and need for physical fitness on the front lines of our health care system.

Brown has served on numerous councils and boards, such as the Manitoba Fitness Council, through which she presented at national meetings on the direction of fitness leadership certification in Canada. Her other professional affiliations are numerous and include the Canadian Council of University Physical Education and Kinesiology Administrators, the Physical Activity Coalition of Manitoba, and Canadian Society for Exercise Physiology.

Brown is a rare combination of leader and a consummate team player. Her noteworthy commitment and vision have made a substantial difference to the Department of Kinesiology and Applied Health, and is she deserving of this honour.



Albert Welter, BSc, MA, PhD

The Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research

Albert Welter is considered Canada's leading expert on the classical period of Chan (Zen) Buddhism in the Song dynasty in China, renowned for his outstanding and careful scholarship in a rapidly growing field of academic interest.

He is regularly invited by universities around the world to give lectures and in 2006 was a Visiting Professor at Renmin University in Beijing. In 2010 he initiated UWinnipeg's East Asian Language and Culture program and has significantly raised the profile of UWinnipeg and the Department of Religion and Culture.

Welter has authored 32 peer-reviewed publications and four books, most recently three formative books on the history and thought of Zen Buddhism published by Oxford University Press. His extraordinary body of research has been supported, since 1999, by an impressive six Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada grants.

Welter has delivered more than 70 conference papers at leading universities in Asia, Europe and North America, including the Universities of Tokyo, Hong Kong, Beijing,

Oslo, Bonn and Berkeley. His scholarship is described by peers as reliable, informative and thorough based on the difficult and important reading of primary sources. His analysis is informed by a deep immersion in the works of both modern Japanese and Chinese historians, and he brings to this material a distinctive social historical methodology that is of particular significance.

For his outstanding contributions to an international body of academic research, The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Albert Welter with the Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research.





Kevin Lamoureux, BA, MEd, PhD Candidate

Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance

Kevin Lamoureux is a dedicated teacher who is strengthening The University of Winnipeg's mission to reach out to non-traditional students and provide more pathways into post-secondary education. As a gifted and engaged instructor with the Faculty of Education's ACCESS program, Lamoureux has developed expertise in groundbreaking mentorship and inclusion programs as well as governance models within Aboriginal education. ACCESS provides an opportunity for students from Winnipeg's inner city with non-traditional academic backgrounds to become teachers, through academic supports, counselling services, cultural teachings, and a warm supportive environment.

Lamoureux is heavily invested in the Manitoba school system and has become a well-known professional development speaker for school divisions, government agencies and community groups. He recently authored *Inclusion in Partnership* with the Winnipeg School Division and École River Heights School which offers a guide for teachers looking to include Aboriginal perspectives into their classrooms. He was lead author of *Mentoring in a Canadian Context* (2008) which is based on the belief that all children deserve to be engaged, challenged and supported, and that teachers can play a vital role in preventing youth from falling between the cracks. His expertise in building

school climates where Aboriginal students and all non-traditional students will be successful is sought after in numerous keynote speaking engagements.

Lamoureux recently won the International Centre for Innovation in Education's Young Scholar Award in Ulm, Germany, as well as the University of New England's award for outstanding academic achievement in Graduate Studies. He is currently pursuing his PhD at the University of New England.

Lamoureux is nurturing a new generation of teachers who will create classrooms where all students can enjoy success, including troubled children and youth and Aboriginal students. Just as importantly, he is helping to shape a vision for Aboriginal education within UWinnipeg's Faculty of Education.

For his many ongoing contributions, discharged with quiet humility, The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Kevin Lamoureux with The Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance.



Laurence Broadhurst, BA, BEd, MA

Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching

Consistently described by his students as a brilliant and passionate professor who has inspired their learning, Laurence Broadhurst has made a lasting mark on a generation of minds. He teaches in the Department of Religion and Culture and the Department of Classics in the Faculty of Arts at UWinnipeg.

Broadhurst is celebrated for his teaching excellence, for his effortless ease in the classroom, and for his availability to students outside of it. Attendance is consistently high in Broadhurst's courses, with students arriving early and staying after class to continue discussions and pepper him with questions. His conversations flow from genuine engagement with his students and are conducted with humour and the generosity he inspires. Broadhurst's teaching process allows his students to tackle difficult material with understanding and fosters confidence in their abilities. His enthusiasm is infectious and his breadth of knowledge spans the ancient Greeks through early and medieval Christianity; Beowulf to modern pop culture.

Broadhurst is a consummate professional, a superb scholar, and a respected teacher. His interest in and care for his

students are reflected by their consistent feedback, which declares their respect for him and his remarkable integrity.

Broadhurst's support of The University of Winnipeg is consistent with his passion for his students. 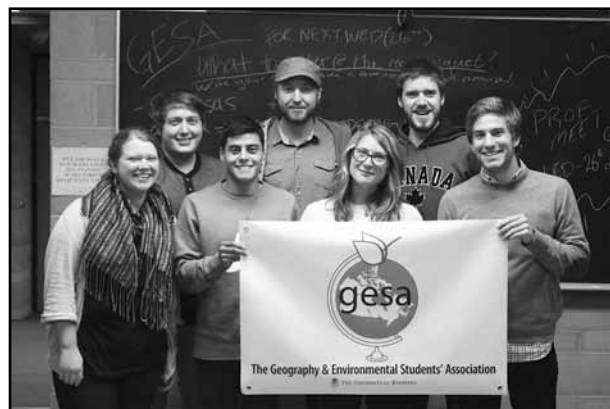


The Geography and Environmental Students Association

Campus Sustainability Recognition Award

The University of Winnipeg is pleased to present the Campus Sustainability Recognition Award to the Geography and Environmental Students Association (GESA).

GESA created a vision for an Eco Grant to support campus-based projects that have a focus on sustainability and are spearheaded by students, faculty members, staff, or community members who have direct affiliation with the University. GESA members conduct fundraising campaigns to support this innovative idea. People apply for the Eco Grant to fund a project that will impact the University campus sustainability and environmental efforts, empower people to engage in sustainable initiatives on campus and in their personal lives, and allow people to execute their ideas by providing them with funding. This year, the Eco Grant was awarded to establish two beehives on campus in an effort to help declining honeybee populations in North America. The sustainability issues around honey bees are complex, because we rely on them so heavily as valuable



pollinators in our industrial food system. The hives will be visibly located and signage will educate students and other passers-by about the project. A small student group will assist with the beekeeping. Creation of the Eco-Grant and all the associated fundraising work represents a true investment in the sustainability potential of students, faculty and staff.

Judy Dyck, BA, MA

Stars of Spence Prize

The late Judy Dyck was a passionate student advocate whose service to The University of Winnipeg spanned more than 30 years. She is being honoured with the inaugural Stars of Spence Street Prize for her dedication to the University and zeal for the well-being of her students.

Dyck began her career on campus as an admissions officer in 1978; the role was followed by her 20-year directorship of the Awards and Financial Aid office. She was renowned for her leadership and active engagement with students, as well as for her breadth of knowledge and expertise on student financial matters. She served her alma mater with distinction until health matters led to an early retirement in March 2011.

Dyck's genuine affection for students shone through her in her ardor to assist them in meeting their educational goals. While serving the University in various capacities, including as a member of the Board of Regents, she ensured that student interests were always at the forefront. She campaigned for decisions made to be fair and equitable, and was so devoted to the importance of student financial aid that she focused her master's degree research on the topic.

Dyck believed in the importance of creating new scholarships and prizes to help further student education, and worked closely with The University of Winnipeg Foundation to ensure donor gifts were properly disbursed. She led by example, establishing the Edmond and Dorothy Dyck Scholarship in education to honour her parents, who were both educators.

Dyck's student advocacy went beyond campus; she passionately brought student aid issues to the national stage. She presented to federal government budget planning committees, outlining specific ideas for improving the assessment of financial need and improved student aid packages. Dyck advocated that the majority of funding be disbursed as bursaries to students with demonstrated financial need, rather than as scholarships, thereby making education more accessible. She was also involved in the federal government's Canada Millennium Scholarship Foundation.

Through her work and guidance, Dyck helped thousands of students. She provided sage advice and genuine caring to students in their times of need. A lifelong learner herself, Dyck derived pleasure from enhancing and facilitating student learning. She enjoyed hearing from students after their graduation, as they often updated her on their achievements and successes.

Judy Dyck passed away on November 18, 2011

The Stars of Spence Street Prize recognizes a University of Winnipeg employee with long and dedicated service, a passion for student learning and a demonstrated commitment to supporting students in achieving their educational goals.



Stefano Grande, BSc

Distinguished Alumni Award

Stefano Grande, an Urban Planner with a BSc. from The University of Winnipeg in Geography & Environmental Studies, honed his city planning skills while working in the Town of Selkirk, MB, the R.M. of St. Andrews and the R.M. of St. Clements for seven years – where he focused on community economics, tourism and business development. More recently, Grande has played an instrumental role in the revitalization of Winnipeg's inner city in his position as General Manager of Winnipeg Housing Rehabilitation Corporation, which he held for six years. During his tenure, he created over a hundred affordable housing units in the inner city by working closely with community groups – helping them achieve their vision for safe and vibrant neighbourhoods through housing renewal.

Grande gave back to the University of Winnipeg in 2011 by establishing an annual BIZ Bursary for deserving business students.

As the current Executive Director for the Downtown Winnipeg BIZ, Grande is focussed on increasing the BIZ's service delivery to business members in the areas of safety and litter removal, in particular, as well as increased

advocacy in areas including downtown housing, police foot patrols, Tax Increment Financing (TIF) and Rapid Transit, and other key policies critical to the long term renewal of downtown.

Grande is regarded as one of the key voices on downtown, inner city and housing renewal issues and opportunities. While balancing a family life which includes three young boys, Stefano continues to give back to the community by serving on the International Downtown Association, Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce, Downtown Winnipeg Council, and as Chair of the Winnipeg Parking Authority Advisory Board.

Grande is passionate about helping those less fortunate off of the streets and into permanent, healthier lifestyles. At the BIZ, he has helped raise funds to assist the homeless and connect them with supportive housing and employment opportunities.

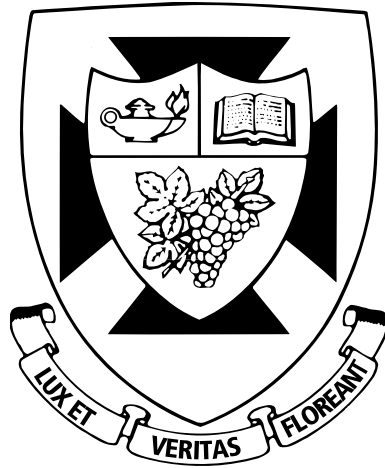

The University of Winnipeg Coat of Arms

The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of the University during the academic session of 1972-73. The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesley Colleges, the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The grape symbol has its origin in the College seal adopted in the charter of 1871. The cross, the lamp, and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesley College, designed in 1897 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross, the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity, was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield, the symbol of protection. The lamp, the symbol of light, also represents learning, to which the Colleges have been devoted to for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book, representing instruction in the way of life and the bringing of understanding to the student, symbolizes knowledge in a general sense, although it may carry overtones of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.

The motto, placed upon a scroll below, is the United College motto, her retained: Lux et Veritas Floreant (Let Light and Truth Flourish). The words catch the central import of the lamp (light) and the open book (truth), and express the hope that both may flourish (as the grape) in our country (the cross).

Academic Dress

*A*cademic dress originated in medieval times to provide warmth in the damp halls of learning. In its present form it includes a gown, hood (worn over the shoulders), and a cap or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive dress for each degree offered which explains the variety seen in the academic procession.

University of Winnipeg academic dress conforms to the North American Intercollegiate Code. All graduates wear a black gown which varies according to the degree conferred. The bachelor's gown is worn closed in front and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn either open or closed in front and has closed sleeves with an opening to free the hands. The front portion of the sleeve below the opening has a long semi-circular cut-out. Doctorate gowns also may be worn open or closed. They are faced with velvet.

The edging colour on the hood indicates the faculty in which a degree is conferred: Theology – red; Science – gold; Education – blue; Arts – white. The width of edging is determined by the degree: three inches for doctors; two inches for masters and bachelors. Hoods are lined in red with a white chevron.

Honorary doctors' gowns are red in colour and are faced with white velvet. They are worn with red Tudor bonnets. The hood colour signifies the honorary degree: white for Laws; golden yellow for Science; admiralty blue for Letters; purple for Divinity. Hoods are lined in red and white, The University of Winnipeg colours. Fellows wear a gown of blue with neither hat nor hood. Members of the University's senior administration wear gowns of varying colours. They do not wear hoods.

The Banner

*T*he banner, prominently displaying the Coat of Arms, was unveiled in 1988. The volunteer effort of Pat Corner, Fran Farquhar, Susan Ferguson, and Sonya C. Wright took more than 1,000 hours. Over 400 meters of thread and 30 meters of wool material went into the project using traditional techniques such as quilting, embroidery, and crewel.
