Arthur B. McDonald BSc, MSc, PhD, PEng, CC

HONORARY DOCTOR OF SCIENCE

Dr. Arthur B. McDonald is a Nobel Prizewinning astrophysicist with a reputation for inspiring leadership, collaboration, and technical innovation.

He is renowned for his ground-breaking discovery that neutrinos (the tiniest subatomic particles in the universe) have mass, which led to a 2015 Nobel Prize in Physics, an honour he shares with Japanese physicist Dr. Takaaki Kajita.

McDonald is one of six Canadians to receive the Nobel Prize in physics, and one of two whose work took place in Canada. His research shattered the existing Standard Model of Particle Physics framework, providing new insight into how the universe evolves and confirming models of the sun that inform our understanding of the basic laws of physics.

McDonald's prestigious career began with a BSc and MSc at Dalhousie University, and a PhD at the California Institute of Technology. Over the years, he has mentored countless scientists — as a professor at Princeton University (1982-1989) and then at Queen's University (1989-2013), where he is now professor emeritus.

A superstar amongst Canadian physicists, McDonald actively encourages the international scientific community to work collaboratively to solve technical problems in the pursuit of new knowledge. While retired from teaching, he continues to be active in research and is a Companion of the Order of Canada, a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, and Fellow of the Royal Society of the UK and Commonwealth.

Since 1989, McDonald has directed the Sudbury Neutrino Observatory (SNO), leading large, international scientific collaborations with an inclusive and communicative leadership style that encourages and inspires scientists at all levels.

In addition to his Nobel Prize, he has received numerous awards and recognitions for his work, including the Canadian Association of Physicists Medal for Lifetime Achievement, the NSERC Award of Excellence, the Gerhard Herzberg Canada Gold Medal for Science and Engineering, the Killam Prize in the Natural Sciences, and the Breakthrough Prize in Fundamental Physics.

For his significant contribution to neutrino physics and astrophysics research, and his prominent role in leading Canada into the spotlight for technological innovation, The University of Winnipeg is proud to bestow an Honorary Doctor of Science on Dr. Arthur B. McDonald.

CLARENCE ATCHISON AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN COMMUNITY SERVICE

Sharanpal Ruprai and Chantal Fiola are scholars who actively engage with marginalized communities.

Ruprai is an assistant professor of women's and gender studies and a public intellectual. She is a multimedia scholar and artist who uses poetry, essays, and experimental film to explore issues of religion, gender violence, and identity within the specific context of Canadian South Asian women's experience.

Fiola is an assistant professor of urban and inner-city studies and an award-winning writer. She is Red River Métis, with family from St. Laurent and Ste. Geneviève, Manitoba and identifies as Two-Spirit (2S).

Ruprai and Fiola co-chaired Two-Spirit and Queer and Trans People of Colour (QTPOC): A Call to Conversation with LGBTQ and Allies Conference (C2C), a historic international event hosted by UWinnipeg in October 2017.

Under their leadership, C2C was purposively structured to feature leading national and international scholars who are 2S and QTPOC — two of the most marginalized groups in Canada — and LGBTQ and cisgender heterosexual allies. The results were transformational for participants in terms of relationshipbuilding and scholarship across marginalized and mainstream communities.

C2C concluded with Ruprai and Fiola leading delegates in a collaborative process to create Calls to Action, which were launched in March 2019, to address the marginalization of 2S and QTPOC people. The Calls to Action will help guide creation of inclusive spaces and specifically address the discrimination experienced by 2S and QTPOC people based on gender identity, racialization, and sexuality.

Ruprai and Fiola have also co-chaired the UWinnipeg committee that organizes Pride events on campus. Their collaboration contributed to the creation of an inclusive, multicultural, multigenerational celebration that brings everyone from toddlers to elders and drag queens to dignitaries to UWinnipeg.

The University of Winnipeg honours Sharanpal Ruprai and Chantal Fiola with the Clarence Atchison Award for Excellence in Community Service in recognition of their historic and transformative contribution to the resurgence currently underway among local, national, and international Two-Spirit and QTPOC communities.

CLIFFORD J. ROBSON MEMORIAL AWARD FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

Despite the challenges that come with teaching a required first-year course to more than 200 students, Ian Burley has a way of making long-lasting connections with his physics pupils.

Recognized for his openness to trying innovative ways of learning, along with his accessibility to students outside of class, Burley consistently receives glowing course evaluations with complimentary reviews of his teaching style.

A former student who took Burley's Introduction to Physics course said: "This was my favourite class that I took this year, and although it was somewhat hard, I would take it again. The professor is really great, his explanations are really clear, and he makes really complicated material a lot easier to understand. He is available and interested in helping students in the most respectful and caring way."

Before teaching it at UWinnipeg, Burley taught the introductory physics course for 17 years to students in northern Manitoba communities. Using a distance education system, he was able to effectively communicate ideas around challenging physics information to students he could see only on a screen.

Burley's impact as an educator has come full circle — one of his former students, Cam Cerasani, is now a mathematics and physics teacher at UWinnipeg's Collegiate.

Cerasani credits Burley's guidance with influencing his career path: "My experiences with Ian directly inspired me to pursue a career in physics education. He was an exemplary role model and provided me firsthand experience and an example of what it meant to be an excellent teacher."

For furthering his students' education through innovative methods of teaching, always being accessible outside of class, and helping them develop a passion for the subject of physics, The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Ian Burley with the Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Teaching Excellence.

BSc (Hons)

STUDENT CAMPUS SUSTAINABILITY RECOGNITION AWARD

Danielle Nowosad is described as a natural leader who actively encourages her peers to engage with environmental and sustainability issues. She is known for her dedication and passion as a researcher at the Churchill Northern Studies Centre (CNSC) in Manitoba, and among her colleagues and professors at The University of Winnipeg.

Inspired by the students and researchers she met at CNSC, Nowosad enthusiastically took on an independent research project investigating nutrient uptake in subarctic pond sediments. This project resulted in several poster and conference presentations across the country and in Norway, which is an impressive feat for someone so early in their career.

Her time at CNSC solidified her research experience and transformed her into an ambassador for the protection of northern ecosystems threatened by human activities. As an environmental ambassador, Nowosad engages the public in regards to her research and issues that affect the environment. She is a dedicated community organizer, volunteering at Oak Hammock Marsh, the 2018 Manitoba Envirothon Provincial High School Competition, and various other regional Envirothon competitions and training events.

She has received numerous awards, including the prestigious Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada (NSERC) Undergraduate Student Research Award, which allowed her to continue her research at the CNSC.

Nowosad's interests include volunteering and fundraising for a women's shelter and guest-judging the Frontiers North School Division and St James School Division science fairs.

Nowosad completed a Bachelor of Science (Honours) in geography earlier this year and is currently working towards a Master of Science degree in integrative biology at the University of Guelph.

Joseph Nnadi BA (Hons), MA, MEd, PhD

PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Since his arrival at The University of Winnipeg in 1990, Dr. Joseph Nnadi has been an engaged member of the campus community. He retired as a Senior Scholar in 2012. Prior to his time at UWinnipeg, Nnadi led a successful career as lecturer, Head, Associate Dean, and Dean of Arts at various universities in Nigeria.

Nnadi is described as a dedicated and thoughtful colleague with very clear convictions, especially those relating to the academic integrity of universities, programs, and courses.

Nnadi's work is modern. He is informed by solid research and valuable insights from feminism and post-colonial literary theory. His passion for research is further reflected in his teaching, which has enriched the offerings to UWinnipeg students.

One area Nnadi has particularly enhanced through his innovative study is that of female African poets, such as Mariama Bâ and Mariama N'doye.

Nnadi is also an expert on French poetry: he has taught and developed courses in French poetry, drama, and novels of the 19th century. He has published several books, including two on Charles Baudelaire's vision of Africa and African women, which filled a gap in Baudelairian scholarship, and two others, on the history of black pioneers in Canada and in St. Boniface.

Nnadi is a renowned scholar in French literature whose reputation extends beyond UWinnipeg. He has refereed 27 articles; his insights and analyses are written with precision and sharp critical thinking in French, Caribbean, and African studies. Nnadi's fifth book, Humanities in Contemporary Nigerian Education, assessed educational options that are, more than ever, relevant in today's Africa and around the world.

The University of Winnipeg honours Dr. Joseph Nnadi as Professor Emeritus for his research, scholarly work, and engaged teaching in both the academic sphere and the wider community.



Phyllis Webster BA, DipEd, MA

FELLOWSHIP IN UNITED COLLEGE

During her 21 years at The University of Winnipeg Collegiate, Phyllis Webster left a mark that will last a lifetime. Using a wealth of experience obtained while teaching outside of Canada, she mentored and inspired generations of students in her English and journalism classes.

Her impact was also felt outside of the classroom. With the help of her students and colleagues, Webster introduced and facilitated the award-winning Collegiate literary magazine, *Mindscape*, along with the Collegiate Debating Club and the Collegiate News Magazine.

UWinnipeg Collegiate alumna Laura Butler described Webster as one of the pillars of her education: "I cannot imagine what my academic experience would look like without her. In my mind, she is the very essence of what a teacher — especially a teacher at The University of Winnipeg Collegiate — should strive to be: an educator committed to inspiring academic excellence and nurturing a joy of learning and discovery in his or her students."

Webster was also very active administratively, as she was a representative for the

University Library Committee and served on the Meaningful Assessment and Curricular Reform Committee, which was a joint UWinnipeg and UWinnipeg Collegiate initiative.

Prior to arriving at the Collegiate, Webster taught at Winnipeg's River East High School and spent six years teaching overseas in South Africa, Australia, and England. During school breaks while on staff at The Collegiate, she taught as a volunteer in South Africa and Costa Rica, with the support of her Deans.

Beyond teaching, Webster has been an important part of her Fort Garry community. She was the founding member and first cochair of the parent co-operative preschool Friends Together, was a founding member of the Fort Garry Family Life Centre, and sat on several school board committees.

For her decades of dedication to UWinnipeg's Collegiate, being an outstanding colleague, and for inspiring the thousands of students who walked into her classroom, The University of Winnipeg is proud to honour Phyllis Webster with Fellowship in United College.



Ross Leckow BA (Hons), LLB, LLM

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

Ross Leckow graduated from The University of Winnipeg in 1980 with a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) degree, earning the Gold Medal in History and Silver Medal in Arts. He also holds a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of Manitoba and a Master of Laws degree from York University.

After practicing law in the Canadian private and public sectors, Leckow joined the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in Washington, DC in 1990. The IMF is an international organization with 189 member countries that promotes international monetary cooperation, global financial stability, and sustainable economic growth throughout the world.

As Deputy General Counsel, Leckow helped strengthen the legal framework through which the IMF monitors developments in the global economy, promotes the implementation of sound economic policies by governments, and provides emergency financial assistance to countries experiencing economic crises. He also led the IMF's substantial program of technical assistance to governments seeking to modernize their legal frameworks to ensure that banks are properly regulated and that national authorities can respond effectively to the potential failure of large financial institutions. A key focus of Leckow's work in recent years has been the development of regulatory frameworks governing the application of new technologies, such as cryptocurrencies and blockchain, in the financial sector. Leckow played a leading role in advancing the IMF's "Fintech" agenda of research and policy, training seminars, and technical advice to IMF member countries.

In July 2019, he left the IMF to accept a new position as Senior Advisor Fintech — Strategy and Legal with the Bank for International Settlements (BIS) in Basel, Switzerland. The BIS is an international organization with 60 member central banks that fosters international monetary and financial cooperation. Leckow will provide strategic and legal advice to the new BIS Innovation Hub that will develop public goods in the technology space to improve the functioning of the global financial system, and serve as a focal point for a network of central banks on innovation.

Leckow lectures around the world on international monetary and financial law, and has authored or co-authored numerous publications on these topics.

The University of Winnipeg Alumni Association is proud to recognize Ross Leckow as the recipient of its highest honour, the Distinguished Alumni Award.



Anna Evans-Boudreau BA (Hons)

VALEDICTORIAN

Anna Evans-Boudreau discovered her passion for sociology at The University of Winnipeg.

After finishing high school, she left Winnipeg for McGill University in Montreal. However, it wasn't the right fit for her and she took time off, returned home, and became a yoga teacher.

Now, she's graduating with a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in sociology.

"I was thinking school just wasn't for me when I left McGill, but when I came to UWinnipeg I immediately fell in love with the environment, the professors, and how you can make those important connections," she said.

Some of those influential professors were Colin Goff, Abigail Klassen, and, most notably, Kimberley Ducey, whom Evans-Boudreau calls "like family."

"I've never met anyone who's so meant to be a professor and never fails to have a smile on her face like Kimberley Ducey," she said. "When you're talking to her, you know she really cares about what you're interested in."

Looking forward, Evans-Boudreau's sights are set on law school with a specific focus on criminal law, human rights law, and law pertaining to Indigenous legal traditions and relations.

"Majoring in sociology has made me see that experiences often labeled and stigmatized as the fault of individuals are actually the result of larger societal issues," she said. "I feel like law is one of the most effective vehicles to continue what I love about sociology."

As she reflects on her four years at UWinnipeg, Evans-Boudreau offers this piece of advice for her fellow graduates: "Don't be too hard on yourself — learning is not linear. After graduating, you'll find out a lot about your limits and also your abilities."

CONVOCATION TRADITION



ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic dress originated in medieval times to provide warmth in the damp halls of learning. In its present form it includes a gown, hood (worn over the shoulders) and a cap or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive dress for each degree offered, which explains the variety seen in the academic procession.

The University of Winnipeg academic dress conforms to the North American Intercollegiate Code. All graduates wear a black gown which varies according to the degree conferred. The bachelor's gown is worn closed in front and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn either open or closed in front and has closed sleeves with an opening to free the hands. The front portion of the sleeve below the opening has a long semi-circular cut-out. Doctorate gowns also may be worn open or closed. They are faced with velvet.

The edging colour on the hood indicates the faculty in which a degree is conferred: Graduate Studies — red; Science — gold; Education — blue; Arts — white; Business & Economics — brown; Kinesiology — green. The width of edging is determined by the degree: three inches for doctors; two for masters and bachelors. Hoods are lined in red with a white chevron.

Honorary doctors' gowns are red in colour and are faced with white velvet. They are worn with red Tudor bonnets. The hood colour signifies the honorary degree: white for Laws; golden yellow for Science; admiralty blue for Letters; purple for Divinity. Hoods are lined in red and white — The University of Winnipeg colours. Fellows wear a gown of blue with neither hat nor hood. Members of The University's senior administration wear gowns of varying colours. They do not wear hoods.

INDIGENOUS GRADUATION STOLES

Destiny Seymour is an Anishinaabe interior designer who is creating her own textiles that are reviving local Indigenous pottery and bone tool patterns from Manitoba. These ancient patterns have been dated from 400 to over 3,000 years old. Indigo Arrows is a company founded by Destiny that turns these textiles into modern home goods.

Destiny was approached to design custom graduation stoles for the Indigenous graduating students of The University of Winnipeg.

Each linen stole is handmade and block printed in Winnipeg. The pattern design is inspired by the repeated and delicate pattern stamping found on local Indigenous pottery, with colours reflecting The University of Winnipeg.



THE UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG COAT OF ARMS

The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of The University during the academic session of 1972-73. The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesley Colleges, the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The grape symbol has its origin in the College seal adopted in the charter of 1871. The cross, the lamp and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesley College, designed in 1897 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross - the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity — was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield — the symbol of protection. The lamp — the symbol of light — also represents learning, to which the Colleges have been devoted for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book — representing instruction in the way of life and the bringing of understanding to the student - symbolizes knowledge in a general sense, although it may carry overtones of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.

The motto, placed upon a scroll below, is the United College motto, here retained: Lux et Veritas Floreant (Let Light and Truth Flourish). The words catch the central import of the lamp (light) and the open book (truth), and express the hope that both may flourish (as the grape) in our country (the cross).



CONVOCATION PODIUM

The custom-made podium now used during our convocation ceremonies reflects the importance of Indigenous culture and identity at The University of Winnipeg. It was designed in consultation with students and staff, and was created by Destiny Seymour and Mamie Griffith of Woven Collaborative, a local Indigenous-led design studio. The podium was built with reclaimed Manitoba oak slabs, representing the importance of the land we stand on. Four rivers, symbolizing how water binds us all together, have been hand-carved into the oak along with copper metal design accents that reflect local Indigenous pottery patterns and honour the history of Indigenous peoples within Manitoba.



TEACHING OF THE STAR BLANKET

Across many Indigenous Nations, the foundational understanding is that we are all related. This understanding includes our relationship to all beings everywhere — and to all things, from the earth to the sky and beyond. In this understanding is that we are beings that come from the stars and our relationship extends to this dimension. The teachings and gifts of the Star Blanket extend from this understanding.

The teaching of the Star Blanket is different across nations. Though the purpose remains the same, it is a healing modality.

From the Ojibwe comes the story of a young baby that had an incurable illness. Her family took her to a medicine woman, who after four days was given the teaching to make a Star Blanket and wrap the little one in it. It was the star people that would do the healing. After four days of ceremony, the little girl was unwrapped.

From the Dakota comes the teaching that the blanket represents the star that we come from, and to be wrapped in the blanket reconnects to our original home and a place of safety.

From the Cree, comes a similar teaching, though the points of the star are different.

Today, the Star Blanket is often used as a gift of honour and recognition of relationships. How honourable it is indeed to be given a gift that reconnects the recipient to the spirit of all things.



A Star Blanket made for UWinnipeg by Andrea McCluskey from our Aboriginal Student Services Centre will be displayed inside Riddell Hall for the duration of the convocation ceremonies. Graduates and family members are welcome to pose for photos in front of the blanket.
