Service Animal in Residence Procedure

Students who have a documented disability and require a Service Animal as an accommodation may request to house the animal with them in Residence. Prior to bringing a Service Animal on The University of Winnipeg property, the student (who is the handler) must collect and submit the required documentation to Accessibility Services. Students should read and understand the Service Animals on Campus Policy and Procedures.

You will need to submit the following to Accessibility Services:

- Documentation on letterhead from a medical assessor, including but not limited to: physician, occupational therapist, ophthalmologist, audiologist, psychologist, psychiatrist, speech-language pathologist, or physiotherapist (Accessibility Services can also provide a medical documentation form for your medical assessor to complete. If possible, meet with Accessibility Services prior to meeting with your medical assessor regarding appropriate accommodations and documentation.)
- Documentation must be dated and include the medical assessor's credentials, contact information, and signature. The medical assessor must provide a detailed explanation of the need for the Service Animal as it relates specifically to the individuals' disability, and indicate the specific tasks the Service Animal performs for the handler.
- 3. Documentation from a recognized organization certifying that the animal is trained as a Service Animal to provide assistance for a particular disability. If no such documentation is available, describe in detail the training that the animal has received.
- Documentation from a certified veterinarian on official letterhead indicating that the animal is spayed or neutered (if applicable), all vaccinations are up to date and the Service Animal is in good health.
- Documentation from the City of Winnipeg Animal Registration and Licensing Department indicating that the animal is licensed.
- 6. Additional Tenant Insurance that covers the Service Animal in the residence building (as the standard Tenant Insurance provided by Campus Living does not include this).
- 7. Completed Campus Living "Service Animal in Residence" application form (see reverse).

As per "Service Animals on Campus Proceedures", the principal factors for consideration are:

- 1. Does the animal provide assistance to a person with a disability, which relates to the person's disability?
- 2. Has the animal been individually trained to provide assistance to a person with a disability that relates to the person's disability?

After all required documentation is received by Accessibility Services, a formal review will take place and the handler will be notified of the decision.

Service Animal Agreement

As the Resident and handler of a service animal, I agree to abide by the specific requirements and expectations outlined in the Campus Living Contract and the University of Winnipeg Service Animal Policy and Procedure while living in residence.

- > Service animals must be in good health.
- > Service animals must wear a valid vaccination and identification tag.
- > Service animals must be able to behave safetly in social settings and in proximitiy with other students.
- > As residence is a communal living environment, service animals are required to demonstrate (upon request from Campus Living Staff) that they can handle public access situations.
- > All service animals need to demonstrate the ability to master basic obedience commands and will promptly return to the handler when recalled.
