## Overview

Classics is the study of the Ancient Greek and Roman worlds through language, literature, history, archaeology, and art history. The roots of Modern Western society are to be found in Greco-Roman culture and its remarkable achievements. Courses are designed to provide a broader and deeper contemplation of ancient society and of ourselves as members of our own society. A degree in Classics prepares students for any pursuit that involves analytic thinking and clear communication of complex ideas. For those planning to enter certain professions, such as law, teaching, medicine or theology, knowledge of the classical world can be particularly useful.
