## 4 year BSc (Athletic Therapy) Transfer Student Course Requirements

- 1) Transfer students seeking to complete the requirements of a Bachelor of Science (Athletic Therapy) can do so with a prior or partially completed degree.
- 2) A maximum of 60 credits of equivalent courses can be transferred from another post secondary institution.
- 3) The University Admissions office approves course transfers.
- 4) To meet the University of Winnipeg and Canadian Athletic Therapists Association (CATA) requirements, the student must successfully complete all general and major course requirements, as well as *Residency* requirements for a 4 year Bachelor of Science (Athletic Therapy) degree as stipulated by the University of Winnipeg. It is the *student's responsibility* to consult the academic calendar and also meet with the Kinesiology Department to ensure all degree requirements are being met for graduation.
- 5) **Specific course requirements:**

To graduate with a BSc degree Kinesiology (Athletic Therapy), the transfer student must complete the following courses (or provide evidence that equivalent courses have been completed with the minimum B grade, where appropriate\* at another institution):

### 6) Practicum Experiences:

The University of Winnipeg offers three practicum courses as indicated above. The practicum requirements require a minimum of 600 hours as partial fulfillment of the 1200-hour internship CATA requirement. Normally the student will be required to take these courses at The University of Winnipeg (KIN-2500/3, KIN-3500/6, and KIN-4500/6).

### 7) Course transfer policy:

Students will be required to take the following courses at the University of Winnipeg, unless they have received a grade of B or better from another CATA accredited institution: KIN-2503/3, KIN-3501/3, KIN-3502/3, KIN-3503/3, KIN-3504/3 (see above for course titles).

8) Students wishing to apply to The University of Winnipeg as a transfer student according to the above noted conditions should visit the University of Winnipeg website to apply directly online.

**Note:** Students will be applying directly to the University of Winnipeg and not to the Gupta Faculty of Kinesiology and Applied Health.
