On February 18, 2025, Dr. Catherine-Laura Dunnington and Developmental Studies' students met with Minister Jenna Suds at Saint Boniface Hospital. During the meeting, Minister Suds made an announcement about a continued partnership with the Manitoba government to open childcare centres at hospitals, ensuring that healthcare workers have access to quality childcare at their workplaces.
