

2025 UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG CHANCELLOR'S EMERGING RESEARCH AWARD

<u>Faculty members within 10 years of completing their PhD*</u> are invited to submit proposals for The University of Winnipeg's Chancellor's Emerging Research Award.

Candidates for the Chancellor's Emerging Research Award must be recognized scholars in their field of study with a record of research excellence.

*The timeline can be extended to accommodate any leaves undertaken during this period

MANDATE

The Chancellor's Emerging Research Award is intended to sustain and support high levels of scholarly output and to retain faculty who have made, and will continue to make, exceptional contributions to research in their field.

ELIGIBILITY

Candidates should reflect:

- Demonstrated research creativity and excellence within their field;
- Demonstrated potential to achieve and/or expand international recognition in their field within the next five years; and
- Have attracted and developed trainees and students.

TERM

The Award will be given annually to an internal candidate for a non-renewable term of one year.

CONTRIBUTION

Holders of the award will be expected to deliver a public lecture supported by the Research Office.

AWARD

The successful applicant will be awarded a research grant of \$10,000.

APPLICATION

Interested faculty are invited to submit a two-page proposal outlining a research project to be undertaken or continued, a <u>Tri-Agency CV</u>, and two letters of support (one internal and one external). Nominations and self-nominations will be accepted for consideration. Applications will be evaluated by the Vice-President, Academic and Vice-President, Research and Innovation, in consultation with the Research Nomination Committee. A recommendation for appointment will be made to the President, who will announce the result of the search process by June 1, 2025.
