EMISSIONS IMPROVEMENTS


GHG emissions are down 11% over FY2017. This is largely due to two initiatives:

- The installation of two 100 kilowatt boilers in Ashdown Hall. This biomass energy system consumes plant-based pellets and will get the University half-way to its renewable energy target.
- The replacement of steam traps and efficiency upgrades to the Ashdown steam plant



ENERGY CONSUMPTION



RESOURCE CONSUMPTION AND WASTE

WATER

Water use is down 18% from FY2017 thanks to upgrades in building analytics software. Because of ongoing digital monitoring, building operators now receive notifications when utilities like water experience abnormally high usage rates. This means that when water fixtures fail, causing water to flow continuously, the facilities team is able to address the problem much sooner.



FOOD SERVICE

Diversity Foods' commitment to local, sustainable sourcing and equitable working practices has made us the most sustainable campus food service in Canada for over five years.






WASTE DIVERSION

Data collected from our waste haulers indicates that since FY2014, between 60% and 69% of all waste generated on campus in a given year ends up in landfill. This includes over half of the recyclable and compostable materials generated on campus. The Campus Sustainability Office will be working in 2019 to educate the campus community about proper waste disposal habits as we work toward 50% diversion rate.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

FY2018 saw the introduction of several new outreach initiatives from the CSO.

STUDENTS



In October, the CSO worked with students to establish Eco Team UWinnipeg, a group that provides targeted outreach around the University's sustainability objectives and engages with large-scale environmental challenges through education and activism. Their work has included tabling, recruitment, and waste outreach, including the first "Bin Biltz" on April 4, 2019.

FACULTY



In concert with the Academic Working Group on Sustainability and the Richardson College for the Environment, the CSO is establishing a "community of practice" that formally aligns sustainability focused research and academic efforts on campus. This year we hosted three faculty speaker events and a workshop to examine sustainability-focused courses across discipliness

STAFF



The improved Green Office Program has a two-pronged approach for staff engagement: for those generally interested in sustainability topics, we provide quarterly workshops run by subject experts, and for those who want a more active role, we offer the option to become a GOP Representative a GOP Representative

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
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Solar Generation

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YTD Performance (Gas – Main)




Gas Consumption University of Winnipeg

September, 2016 - November, 2019



Student Engagement



Since September:

- CSO talked with 150 students during Roll Call, and 400 in class talks during the first two weeks
- 80 People completed our student sustainability survey
- Over 30 students attended the first Eco Team meeting of the year, five times more than our first ever meeting
- 10 ET members volunteered for the Climate First Tour (featuring David Suzuki) and participated in the student workshop
- 27 students attended a day-long workshop on the UN SDGs at UM
- Nearly 400 UW students participated in the Global Climate Strike

Waste Audits

The CSO conducted two external waste audits, employing fifteen UW students:

- RBC Convention Centre: One-day audit, October 16
- IG Financial: Three-day audit, October 23-25
- CSO netted roughly \$2500 which will be invested into Eco Team initiatives
- Other potential clients: The Forks; CMHR;
 Fort Whyte Alive
- Two auditors assisted with a pilot project on campus: removing contamination from compost stream before pickup day

- Increase the number of students who are exposed to sustainability during their education (Goal 3, Target 5)
- Provide a structure for offering interdisciplinary sustainability education to our students, encouraging collaboration across departments (Goal 3, Target 4)
- Offering experiential learning and research opportunities relating to sustainability (Goal 3, Target 1)
- Better prepare UWinnipeg students for jobs in competitive sustainability-related fields (Goal 3, Target 3)
- Incentivize sustainability leadership development and action-taking opportunities (Goal 3, Target 1)

Possible Components:

- Capstone/book end courses
- Indigenous course requirement
- Topic specific courses

- Community/campus projects or placements
- Volunteer requirement (such as participating with the UW Eco Team)
- Non-academic leadership development/training


